- At the end of the course, it will be necessary to elaborate and present a work that will consist of the analysis of a specific case, or the elaboration of a proposal, referring to international university cooperation.
- The work must be written and presented in one of the following languages: English, Portuguese or Spanish. Additional information will be transmitted in the first class.

**ABDELJALIL AKKARI** UNIVERSITÉ DE GENÈVE

Abdeljalil Akkari is professor and director of the International Education research group at the University of Geneva, Switzerland. He is also a visiting professor on the faculty of International Relations at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University and a regular consultant to UNESCO and other international organizations. He was the dean of research at the Higher Pedagogical Institute HEP-BEJUNE, Bienne, Switzerland, and an assistant professor at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County, in Baltimore, United States. His main experience and important publications include studies on international cooperation, educational planning, multicultural education, teacher training and educational inequalities. His main research interests are currently focused on teacher training and educational system reforms from a comparative and international perspective.



### ANA SHEILA FERNANDES COSTA UNIVERSIDADE DE BRASÍLIA

PhD in Educational Sciences from the University of Geneva, linked to the research group Dimensions Internationales de l'Education (ERDIE). Since 2017 she has been a professor in the Department of Planning and Administration at the Education Faculty of the University of Brasília. Member of the Research Group on Training and Performance of Teachers / Pedagogues (GEPFAPe) and Red Iberoamericana de Apoyo a la Gestión Educativa. Worked at the Higher Education Secretariat of the Ministry of Education of Brazil (SESu / MEC). He was Manager of International Cooperation Programs and Projects for the Coimbra Group of Brazilian Universities. She also served as a consultant to the Organization of American States (OAS) and the Organization of Ibero-American States (OEI). He has experience in the development of studies in the areas of Public Policy and Education Management, Teacher Training, Internationalization of Educational Policies and Higher Education

Clementina Acedo has a degree in Sociology (1982) from Universidad Católica Andrés Bello (Caracas, Venezuela), a Masters in Education for International Development (1984), a Master in Philosophy (1988) and a Doctorate in Comparative Education International (1997) from the University of Stanford. Since 2001, Ms. Acedo has been a Professor and Co-Director of the Institute for International Studies in Education at the University of Pittsburgh, USA. Previously, she worked as the National Director of the UNDP Social Development Program in Venezuela, then as a Researcher, International Consultant and Professor at the Institute for Higher Management Studies - IESA, in Caracas, and as an Education Specialist at the World Bank. Ms. Acedo was Director of IBE from 2007 to 2014. Currently, she is Director of the University of Webester (Geneva, Switzerland).



### **JOAQUIM DOLZ** UNIVERSITÉ DE GENÈVE

Joaquim Dolz is a professor of language teaching and teacher training at the University of Geneva. Since 1980, he has developed research on language development and on the teaching and learning of languages from the perspective of sociodiscursive interactionism. Among these researches, the best known ones refer to the teaching of oral and written production, textual genres, didactic sequences, learning difficulties and analysis of teaching activity. Member of the research groups GRAFE and FORENDIF, he currently directs his new research on teacher education in French teaching.



### KAREN TAYLOR INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL OF GENEVA (ECOLINT)

With a bachelor's degree in French and Russian from Connecticut College and a master's and doctorate in history from Georgetown University, Karen Taylor has an impressive career as a professor and university professor. Interested in research fields as diverse as Philosophy, Plurilingualism, Language Acquisition, Transculturalism and History of Female Education, Karen Taylor worked at Harvard University, Georgetown University, George Mason and the Smithsonian Museum, and several universities in the United States and Europe . Before joining Ecolint in 2015, she was a dormitory manager at the American School in Switzerland (TASIS) in Lugano. Karen Taylor has published in several academic books and journals and has received several scholarships and academic awards. American citizen, has lived in Europe since 2008 and is fluent in French and English. She also speaks Russian, German and Italian well.

Myriam Radhouane is a postdoctoral fellow at the University of Geneva, Switzerland. His research focuses mainly on intercultural approaches to teacher education and the teaching profession. He leads the IBE-UNESCO Postgraduate Diploma in Curriculum Design and Development currently implemented in Africa and in Latin America and the Caribbean. In addition, Mr Opertti coordinates UNESCO worldwide Community of Practice (COP) in Curriculum Development and supports the implementation of inclusive education initiatives as a follow-up of the 48th session of the International Conference on Education (ICE 2008).

She is an Associate Researcher at the Faculty of Psychology and Educational Sciences at the University of Geneva-Switzerland and former President of the Governing Council of the UNESCO International Institute for Higher Education in Latin America and the Caribbean - UNESCO-IESALC. She was Special Advisor on International Relations at ANDIFES - National Association of Directors of Federal Institutions of Higher Education (2009-2011) and Director of International Relations at the Federal University of Uberlândia-MG, Brazil (2005-2008), where she coordinated programs of the Brazilian government, such as the Graduate Students Agreement Program (PEC-G) and the Graduate Students Agreement Program (PEC-PG). She is also the author and coordinator of several international programs and courses for undergraduate and graduate teachers, researchers and students. 6

His extensive practical experience in education includes a variety of educational positions at UNESCO offices in Mali, Cameroon, Congo (DRC) and Senegal. In his various roles, Mr. Ydo has gained experience in developing partnerships and resource mobilization from development banks, the private sector, UN agencies and governments (self-benefit funds). His efficiency and dynamism allowed him to move from a program specialist to managerial functions, including as a UNESCO Representative in Côte d'Ivoire and Regional Director of the UNESCO Multisectoral Regional Office for West Africa in Abuja, Nigeria.
